Today's Miracles

Imagine for a moment living in Egypt during the time of Moses. Would you recognize the hand of God in the plagues and the Red Sea crossing? Or like many today would you write off Israel's deliverance as a mere coincidence or these phenomena as natural occurrences?

A sincere heartfelt desire of many Christians is to witness signs and wonders in our day. But the truth is many are looking in all the wrong places. An exodus from the nations is occurring right before our eyes and it's going on virtually unnoticed by the world and sadly even by some Christians.

Consider these words of the prophet Jeremiah; *"Therefore behold, the days are coming," says the LORD, "that it shall no more be said, 'The LORD lives who brought up the children of Israel from the land of Egypt,' but, 'The LORD lives who brought up the children of Israel from the land of the north and from all the lands where He had driven them.' For I will bring them back into their land which I gave to their fathers.*

This is an incredible statement in that The Holy One of Israel was known by the events surrounding the exodus from Egypt for thousands of years. However, by His own words He said one day that would all change. He said one day I'd be known for a latter miracle that will surpass the former. **That "one-day" is TODAY!!!**

Think about it, while many are still searching for great signs in the heavens, a greater miracle than the first exodus is currently in process right here on earth. The problem is this miracle is happening in such practical ways that it's often totally overlooked. Among

the many things that Ezra International does is help pay for passports and provide transportation to the airport for poor Jewish people. Yet everyday people apply for passports. Every day people are driven to the airport, and everyday people get on a plane and fly to another country. What makes these activities so special?



What makes the return of the Jewish people so special is a 4000 year-old eternal covenant. What makes this return so special is that Jeremiah penned his words 2700 years ago. He wrote them before the temple was destroyed the second time and before Israel had been decimated by the Roman legions about 2000 years ago. Israel as a nation vanished from the earth for over 1900 years and the Jewish people would be scattered around the globe. **So for God to be true to His word Israel would have to be re-born as a nation and the Jewish people would have to return**

from the four corners of the earth. The fact is God is zealous for Zion ...Israel was reborn and His children are still returning today!

I consider it miraculous that I have walked the streets of Jerusalem many times. Walking on city streets in any other major city in the world would not be considered a miracle. But the fact that Jerusalem is once again the undivided capital of the modern state of Israel is a miracle and not a mere coincidence. I have seen thousands of people board airplanes over the years and don't consider that to be a miracle either. But every time I watch a Jewish family arrive at the airport and board a plane in order to return to their ancient homeland, I know I've been privy to a miracle.

There is at least one more thing that I would consider a miracle and it's the most personal one. That's the fact that the Creator of the Universe and a holy covenant keeping God would allow you and I to participate in this great work. Isaiah puts it this way:

Thus says the Lord GOD: *"Behold, I will lift My hand in an oath to the nations, and set up My standard for the peoples; They shall bring your sons in their arms, And your daughters shall be carried on their shoulders"*.

In other words, not only are we living in a day of miracles, but we also have the privilege to be a part of them. You just simply need to know where to look!
